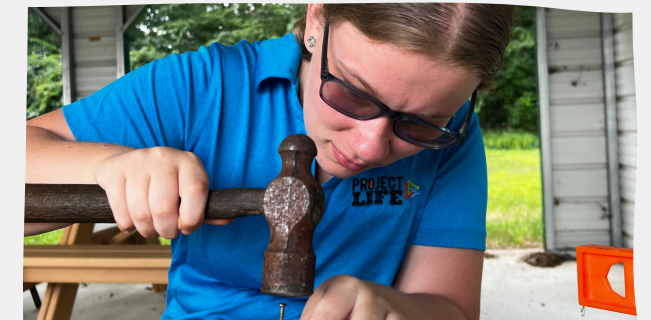
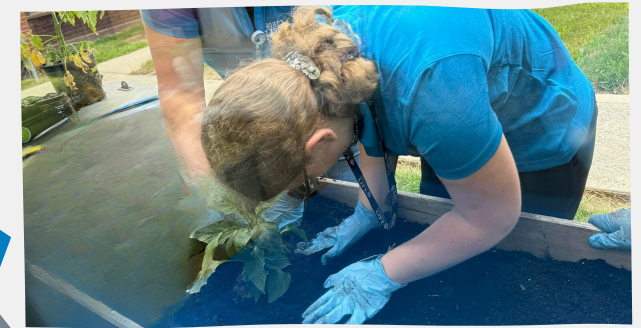


Project LIFE Intern Spotlight:
