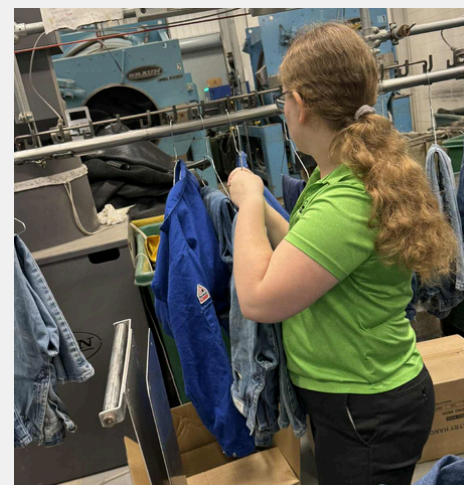
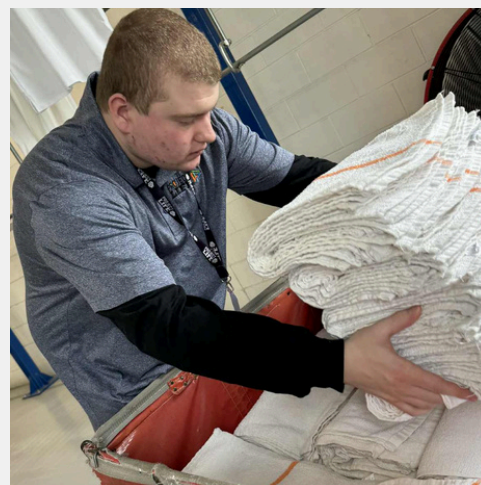
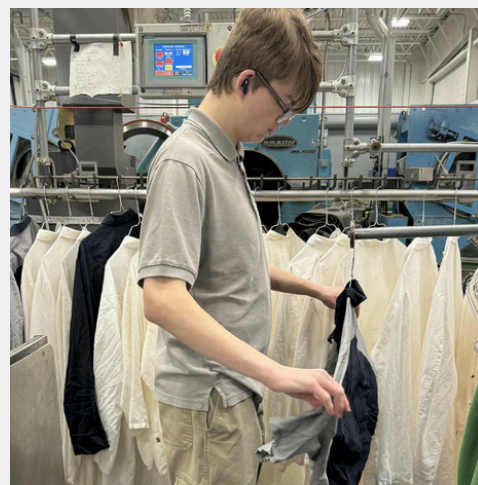

BUILDING BONDS BEYOND THE BUILDING



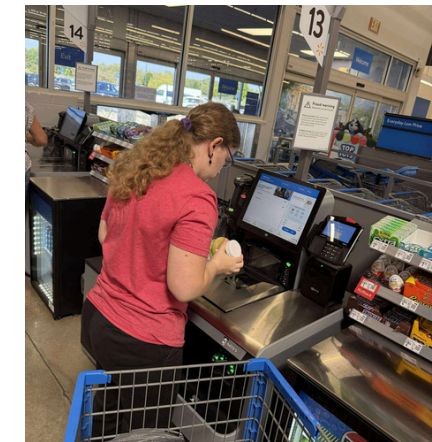
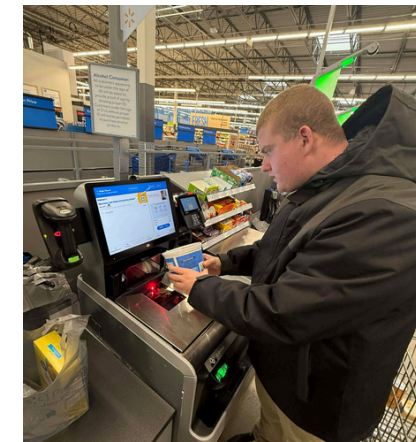
